- ✓ Have your official college transcripts sent as soon as possible.
- ✓ Send all documents to the address provided in the application instructions.

As soon as your file is complete, we will begin the **admissions review process**.

3 AFFORD

Transfer students may be eligible for financial aid. You must file the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**, available online at fafsa.gov.

How long will it take me to earn my degree at Stockton?

Most degrees at Stockton require a minimum of 128 credits to complete. Some require more.

Will credits I earned at an institution that is not regionally accredited transfer?

Unfortunately, no. Additionally, we are not able to accept credits from certificate-granting proprietary institutions, such as computer science institutes or technical business schools that are unaccredited.

If I do not hold an associate degree, can I still transfer to Stockton?

Yes, your transcript is then evaluated on a course-by-course basis.

Does my grade point average transfer?

No. You start with a new GPA at Stockton.

Are county college credits accepted at Stockton?

Yes! Stockton guarantees that if you hold an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) from a New Jersey community college, or an accredited community college from another state, we will accept the degree intact, up to 64 credits. Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degrees will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis. How will I know which credits have transferred?

Shortly after your admission acceptance, you will receive instructions on how to access your current credit evaluation in Degree Works, an advising & registration tool that you will utilize throughout your time at Stockton. It's important to note that only courses for which we have an official transcript will be evaluated; any courses in progress or on an unofficial transcript will not be evaluated until receipt of an official transcript. Unofficial transcripts will be used for admissions purposes only.



Free Tuition & Fees Programs

The Stockton Promise grant and Garden State Guarantee are last-dollar programs created to help NJ students afford a college education. Eligible students may have their tuition & fees fully covered. Accepted transfer students are considered for scholarships based on previous college performance.

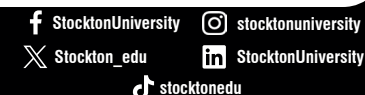
Excellence in Academics Award Transfer Scholarship

GPA 3.4 – 3.74 ^ = \$1,000/year
 GPA 3.75 – 3.99 ^ = \$2,000/year
 GPA 4.0 ^ = \$3,000/year

- Must have 24 or more earned, transferable, non-basic skills credits from a regionally accredited undergraduate institution.
- Cumulative GPA minimum: 3.4
- New transfer applicants only; students applying for readmission, first-year or second bachelor's degree applicants do not qualify.

* All award recipients must complete the FAFSA. Full-time enrollment only (12+ credits per semester). Continuous enrollment required to maintain scholarship. Must maintain cumulative Stockton GPA of 3.0. Scholarship remains in effect for up to six (6) consecutive semesters for transfer students. Award cannot be used for summer courses. Visit stockton.edu/scholarships for more details.
 ^ Transcripts from all institutions previously attended will be used to calculate cumulative GPA.

Transfer up to **64 credits** from a regionally accredited community college and up to **96 credits** from an accredited four-year school.

- We have a liberal policy for credits more than 10 years old and course-by-course evaluation for credits more than 30 years old.
- Even if your previous school was on a three-credit system, you will receive full acknowledgement for the class. Any remaining credits can be packaged together to make up one complete class.
- Stockton transcript evaluators help you determine what credits transfer, including Advanced Placement (AP), CLEP or military credits.



Use Degree Works to see how your credits stack up. You can access this audit through stockton.edu/transfer. The Degree Works audit will enable you to see exactly how your transfer credits will be applied to the degree you have chosen.

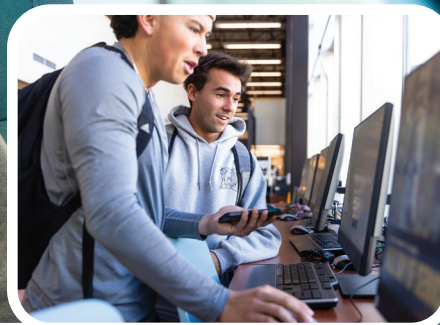
