Today's Festival serves several purposes:


- Celebrates May as Older Americans Month.





SCOSA Vision and Mission for Older Adult Education Programs

The Stockton Center on Successful Aging, in collaboration with the College's School of Graduate and Continuing Studies hopes to dramatically increase the college's educational offerings for older adults. While there is no age-restriction upon enrolling in any of the college's undergraduate or graduate courses, we recognize that short courses, seminars, lectures, study tours, and other activities designed specifically for older learners are all needed in our area.

In order to meet the growing demand for such programs, we are happy to introduce "SCOSA Scholars" – an Annual Membership Program that will offer a variety of educational opportunities for those who are 50 and over. The core offerings of SCOSA Scholars will involve intellectually stimulating, non-credit courses specifically designed for students over 50 years of age who are interested in personal enrichment. Emphasis will be placed on learning for the joy of learning and on keeping in touch with a larger world. In addition, SCOSA Scholars who are 65 or older will have the opportunity to enroll tuition-free on a space available basis in selected undergraduate and graduate credit-bearing courses at the college (additional fees are required).
