

Parking Pass Update

Stockton's new Parking Permit regulations have changed slightly since our <u>September</u> <u>E-News</u>. Thanks to input from SCOSA and others, the hours when permits (permanent or temporary) must be displayed have been reduced to between 8:30 and 3:30pm on Monday through Thursday, and between 8:30am and 2:30pm on Fridays. This makes attendance at the many 4:30pm meetings on Tuesdays and Thursdays much easier and allows us to better welcome outside groups on Friday afternoons when the lots are generally less crowded. Stockton University's Fall 2016 Writer in Residence: Dr. Akhil Katyal

Dr. Akhil Katyal, a poet and translator from India, will be Stockton's Fall 2016 International Writer-in-Residence. Dr. Katyal's poems touch on human rights themes such as LGBTQ issues, caste-ism, labor organizing, the Holocaust, and war and exile, as well as love and loss. His most recent book of poems, *Night Charge Extra* (2015), was shortlisted for the Muse India Satish Verma Young Writer Award.
