During his President's Report to the Stockton University Board of Trustees on February 24th, President Harvey Kesselman acknowledged the efforts of several individuals who have been working to create a formal retiree organization for retired Stockton employees. Tom Chester, director of Human Resources, Gene Swilkey, Human Resources training coordinator, Dave Burdick, SCOSA director, and retirees Barbara Reynolds and Erica Pinto represented the group that has helped to develop the Stockton University Retirees Association (SURA). Retirees will receive many benefits and discount previously reserved for current retirees. A new web-site hosted by the Office of Human Resources provides convenient links to information on benefits, services, programs, SCOSA's monthly newsletter, and other information. SCOSA has been setting its own building blocks to better involve and serve retirees over the past two years and is pleased to collaborate with HR and SURA.

Also at the AGHE conference, Dr. Elizabeth Elmore, professor of economics and gerontology, and director of the Stockton Center on Economic and Financial Literacy (SCEFL) co-chaired a symposium entitled "Aging and Future Careers: Latest Global Trends in Business and Aging, led a resource exchange session on "Innovative Curriculum Activities to Help Students Understand Aging Policy Issues, and co-led a workshop on "New Technologies for Student-Centered Teaching and Advising." Professor Elmore has been an at-large member of AGHE's Executive Committee for the past two years.

SCOSA Director David Burdick is the Selection Committee co-chair of AGHE's Advancement Committee in which he coordinates a \$30,000 funding initiative for AGHE supported with a grant from the Retirement Research Foundation. An April 8th deadline has been posted for an RFP for AGHE committees to apply for pilot funding for innovative, revenue generating projects.
