



Starting on September 5, 2016 Stockton will institute a new parking permit system, which will be in effect on the Main Campus in Galloway. During designated hours and days (currently 7:30am – 4:30pm on Monday through Thursday, and 7:30am until 3:30pm on Fridays) all Stockton employees and students who park on campus must display a valid parking permit from their rear-

view mirror. Guests who park on campus during these times must also register their vehicle, placing a valid temporary parking permit on their dashboard. SCOSA is working with the parking committee and administrators to minimize the inconvenience to our guests, perhaps modifying the hours and/or allowing us to issue temporary permits to our participants via e-mail. We will also investigate whether a SCOSA Membership Program, with modest annual dues, would allow us to obtain more permanent permits for our members. Presently you would need to park in a 15 minute parking spot in front of the campus center or Building 70 (corner of CR575 and Vera King Farris Drive), go to the information desk to register your car and receive a temporary permit, and then return to your car and proceed to park in any lot open to commuters. #### Noting the Passing of Two South Jersey Elder Heroes, SCOSA Supporters By David Burdick

"Dishonor not the old, for one day you will be among them" (Ancient Jewish Proverb)

Two very important South Jersey "Elder Heroes" died recently. We note their passing with a deep sense of gratitude and honor for their profound impact on South Jersey's communities and older adults.

An "Elder Hero" is someone who in their older years continues to lead, inspire, and contribute to the well-being of others and the community; or who, upon retirement finds new opportunities for "third age" pursuits or "encore careers" that provide personal meaning and social impact. Howard Berger and Victor Bressler were two such giants among us who have left their legacies.

Howard Berger, who died in June just shy of his 90th birthday, was a founding member of SCOSA's Community Advisory Board in 2006, but I had grown to know and appreciate his kind spirit and great work years before. As chair of the Atlantic County Senior Citizens Advisory Council and writer for the Jewish Times and the local Gannett newspapers, this former award winning radio broadcaster regularly contacted me and asked "How can I help you inform the public about the great work of Stockton's Gerontology Program?" I've never known a writer who did a better job listening to their subject and then writing a perfect story that captured all the key points and nuances. Moving into the SCOSA era, he was our strongest public advocate.

I had the great honor of serving with Howard as a NJ Delegate to the 1995 White House Conference on Aging. My admiration for him deepened further as we traveled and roomed together in DC, having many lively conversations about the many resolutions delegates were asked to discuss and vote upon.

Howard didn't view his duty as done once the conference was over. Instead, he tirelessly worked to help implement the conference's <u>resolutions</u> and recommendations for years. Ambassador William J. Hughes, who nominated Howard (and me) to serve as delegates, was a member of the Conference Planning Committee and for a time, Chair of the House Select Committee on Aging. A longtime friend of Howard, Ambassador Hughes wrote in the Foreword of Howard's autobiography: "I have been privileged to know Howard Berger for over 40 years ... he became one of our most respected and admired radio hosts (who) was always knowledgeable, fair, and respectful in his dealings with his

guests and the public at large. [As a Member of Congress] I was frequently a guest on his show ... Howard became one of our area's experts on issues which affect the aging in our society, and his contributions to the elderly were legion. (Source: Berger, H. (2015). <u>Victor Bressler, MD</u>, passed away at the age of 92 in May. A tireless advocate for Atlantic City, the health care needs of the less fortunate, and concerns of older adults, he had a particular passion and conviction for educating the medical residents at Atlantic City Medical Center to take a holistic, ethical and caring approach. Many graduates of this program cite Victor's influence as being crucial in their careers, and remember fondly the annual Physician Retreats that he organized and ran for almost two decades.

With a handful of other area physicians, Victor founded New Jersey's first multi-specialty HMO. When the HMO was acquired in 1986, the non-profit Southshore Foundation was created. I had the great fortune of serving as a trustee from 1988 until the foundation closed in 1996 (as VP from '91-'96). While in operation, we gave about \$50,000 per year in grants to local organizations such as ACCC, Stockton, ACMC, Shore Memorial Hospital, Burdette Tomlin Hospital, and local chapters of the American Red Cross, the American Cancer Society, and so many others. Often these were seed grants, encouraging the development of new and innovative programs. One of my favorites was to purchase a "Humor Cart" to lift the spirits of patients young and old at Shore Memorial Hospital. Now, years later, we have ample evidence that medical outcomes are greatly improved when patients are in good spirits and more motivated to succeed in treatment. When the foundation closed down, its remaining assets were transferred to fund scholarships for health care students at Stockton and ACCC, and to continue to provide funding for the Medical Residency Program at ARMC. All told, I believe that the foundation donated nearly \$5,000,000 to worthy community endeavors ... all made possible by Victor Bressler's visionary leadership and care for his community.


