Academic Affairs Priorities: AY 25-26

1. People and Campus Culture

- Improve campus culture and community to foster transparent, collaborative, and accountable leadership and partnership with Academic Affairs
- > Building the Team = Leadership, organizational (re)structure, and staff to most effectively serve students, faculty, and staff
- Professional development

2. Teacher-Scholar Model (academic and student success)

- Academic Program Portfolio: New and revised programs (Gray DI project for program optimization = viability and vitality)
 - Curricular relevancy (students, markets) and distinguishing experiences, modalities, scaling
 assessment and student learning improvements, maximizing enrollment, "fit" at the University,
 student and alumni outcomes, resources such as faculty lines and facilities, etc.
- > Research, scholarship, and creative activities
- > Strategic plans: graduate programs, online education, continuing education, global education



Academic Affairs Priorities: AY 25-26

3. Student Success

- > Tactics (examples):
 - Expansion of the Winter/J-Term pilot
 - Summer Bridge Program pilot (Summer 2025)
 - Advising and precepting; includes summer orientation, recruitment and yield events
 - Transfer agreements, and outbound partnerships for graduates

> Enterprise strategies:

- Ospreys Navigate
- Data-informed, student-centric course scheduling (Coursedog project)
- Elevate and reposition the William T. Daly School of General Studies
- Creating a true first-year experience
- Student Success Committee/Task Force in collaboration with Student Affairs and Enrollment Management
- Task Force on Reimaging General Education





Academic Affairs Priorities: AY 25-26

4. Community Engagement

- > Commitment to being an Anchor Institution for Atlantic County = educational access, collaborative partnerships
- > Implementation of the strategic plan for the Atlantic City campus
- > Collaboration with AtlantiCare as an anchor institution partner

5. Sustainability

- > Optimize resources for instruction, academic support, facilities, and infrastructure needs of students, faculty, and staff. For example, Coursedog scheduling project, workload: supplementals, overloads
- Continue to review, revise and implement processes, practices, and policies for equitable, efficient and effective operations across Academic Affairs and reporting divisions
- > Evaluate mission, programming, business models for all Centers and Institutes; satellite locations




