



Hughes Center Poll: Obama and Christie Favorably Viewed 3rd District Voters Send Governor Mixed Signals

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Pomona, NJ—President Barack Obama is viewed favorably by 63% of the likely voters in the new 3rd Legislative District, while New Jersey Governor Chris Christie is viewed favorably by 48% of likely voters, according to a new Stockton/Zogby poll.*

The poll of 400 likely voters in the new 3rd Legislative District was commissioned by the William J. Hughes Center for Public Policy and run from May 4-7 and has a margin of error of $\pm 5\%$.

President Obama runs particularly well in the 3rd district where he beats Christie in a hypothetical election contest for president, 50% to 37%.

Respondents generally support a number of Governor Christie's policies, such as increasing the amount public employees contribute to healthcare and pensions. However, 79% do not support increasing deductibles and co-pays for senior citizen health programs.

Although his favorability ratings are positive (48% favorable and 45% unfavorable), only 42% would vote for his re-election and 51% are opposed.

"We also took an early look at the upcoming legislative races," Schulman said. "These numbers are just early benchmarks and we can expect to see a lot of movement in the numbers as the campaigns get in gear late in the summer and into the fall."
