Trump's Supreme Court justice will speak to N.J. college students

The first Supreme Court justice appointed by President Donald Trump will speak at Stockton University next week.

Neil Gorsuch, who <u>ioined the court</u> last year, will speak to students Jan. 23 in the university's Performing Arts Center, according to the university.

The event will not be open to the public.

A law school classmate of President Barack Obama, Gorsuch took the seat vacated when Justice Antonin Scalia died in 2016.

He will deliver an address to Stockton students and answer previously submitted questions in a discussion moderated by William J. Hughes, Jr., the son of former ambassador William Hughes.

Gorsuch is the latest member of the Supreme Court to speak <u>at a New Jersey college</u>.

Justice Sonia Sotomayor spoke at Rutgers University in 2016 and Princeton University in 2017.
