- The college's enrollment management effort has been successful in attracting a quality applicant pool from which to enroll new students. Total applications are up nearly $2 \%$ since last fall.
- The total number of new freshmen remained steady at 826. In addition, 865 new transfers, 94 readmits, and 96 new graduate students enrolled. The grand total of new students is 1,881, up 17 from fall 2003.
- Class rank for new freshman has increased from the top 25\% to the top $24 \%$ of their high school graduating class.
- Total SAT scores for regularly admitted freshmen remains more than 100 points higher than New Jersey and national averages for college-bound students at 1133.
- The undergraduate headcount of 6,579 constitutes an increase of 37 over last year's figure. The full-time equivalent (FTE) has increased nearly $2 \%$ to 5,689.
- The average credit load per undergraduate student is up slightly at 13.8 credits. The average credit load for graduate students is 6.9.
- Eighty-four percent of all undergraduates are full time, a $1 \%$ increase since fall 2003.
- The combinedheadcount for graduate and undergraduate students has reached a new record; 7,002. Combined FTE is 5,933, which is $2.3 \%$ greater than last year.
- New student minority enrollment has increased to $12 \%$.
