Fall 2006 Enrollment Report* SUMMARY STATEMENTS

TOTAL ENROLLMENT

◆ Total headcount for Fall 2006 is 7213, representing an increase of 178 students over last fall's total headcount of 7035. Total FTE increased by approximately 3.0% to 6170.

NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT

- With regard to new undergraduates (freshmen and transfer/re-admits) in fall 2006:
 - There are 808 new freshmen and 1123 transfer/re-admits. This represents an overall increase of 169 new students.
 - The total SAT for first-time regularly admitted freshmen is 1118 and the average High School Rank is the 75th percentile.
 - The Honors Program has 29 freshman participants, which has positive ramifications for future recruitment efforts.
 - □ 15 new students enrolled in Stockton's new doctoral program in Physical Therapy
 - □ There are 122 new graduate students enrolled.

UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT

- Third-semester retention rates for first-time full-time freshmen remained strong at 84%.
- Undergraduate FTE increased by 157 to 5885, while the actual headcount of undergraduate students increased by 156 to 6727, as compared to last fall.
- Females constitute 58% of the total undergraduate class; 42% are male. These percentages are consistent with previous years and with national trends.
- The 6 year graduation rate has increased by 2% to 64%

GRADUATE ENROLLMENT

- Graduate and post-baccalaureate FTE increased by 5% over Fall 2005 to a record of 274.
- Headcount increased by 22 students to a record number of 486 students.
