## Fall 2009 Enrollment Report* SUMMARY STATEMENTS

## TOTAL ENROLLMENT

- Total headcount for fall 2009 is 7,559 representing an increase of 252 students over last fall's total headcount of 7,307 . Total FTE increased by approximately 379 to 6701 .


## NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT

- With regard to new undergraduates (freshmen and transfer/re-admits) in fall 2009:
- There are 870 new freshmen and 1105 transfer/re-admits. This represents an increase of 28 freshman an increase of 148 transfer/re-admits for an overall increase of 176 new undergraduate students.
- The total SAT for first-time regularly admitted freshmen is 1143 and the average high school rank is the 81st percentile.
- The Honors Program has 41 new freshman participants, which has positive ramifications for future recruitment efforts.
- There are 275 new graduate students enrolled: 126 new matriculated graduate students are enrolled in a program sponsored by the School of Education. 15 new students enrolled in the State's first Professional Science Master's in Environmental Science Program.


## UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT

- Undergraduate FTE increased by 305 to 6281, while the actual headcount of undergraduate students increased by 146 to 6813 , as compared to last fall.
- Females constitute $57 \%$ of the total undergraduate class; $43 \%$ are male. These percentages are consistent with previous years and with national trends.


## GRADUATE ENROLLMENT

- Graduate and post-baccalaureate FTE increased by 74 over fall 2008 to a record of 420 .
- Headcount increased by 106 students to a record number of 746 students.
