## Fall 2011 Enrollment Report* SUMMARY STATEMENTS

## TOTAL ENROLLMENT

- Total headcount for fall 2011 is 8,108 representing an increase of 229 (3\%) students over last fall's total headcount of 7,879 . Total FTE increased by approximately 356 (5\%) to 7369.


## NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT

- With regard to new undergraduates (freshmen and transfer/re-admits) in fall 2011:
- There are 973 new freshmen and 1,142 transfer/re-admits. This represents a increase of 111 (13\%) freshmen and a decrease of 14 transfer/re-admits for an overall increase of 100 (5\%) new undergraduate students.
- The average combined SAT (Verbal and Math) for first-time regularly admitted freshmen is 1117 - a slight decrease from last year's 1122, and the average high school rank is the 78th percentile, which remains roughly the same as the Fall 2010 freshman class.
- There are 271 new graduate students enrolled including 30 new students enrolled in the new Master's Program for Communication Disorders.


## UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT

- Undergraduate FTE increased by 310 (5\%) to 6,885 , while the actual headcount of undergraduate students increased by 178 (3\%) to 7,240.
- $58 \%$ of the total undergraduate class are female and $42 \%$ are male.


## GRADUATE ENROLLMENT

- Graduate and post-baccalaureate FTE increased by 41 ( $9 \%$ ) over fall 2010 to a record of 484.
- Headcount increased by 51 (6\%) students, to a record number of 868 students.
