SUMMARY STATEMENTS

The College's enrollment management program for the Fall 1995 semester has yielded the most academically qualified freshman and transfer classes in its history.
Academic qualifications as measured by the SAT, academic index, and grade- point average have improved for the ninth consecutive year.
This year's Total SAT score of 1059 for regularly admitted students represents a 5 point increase when compared to last year. High school rank has remained steady at the 80th percentile. The academic index is an impressive 221.9.
The College has experienced enrollment growth as evidenced by a 3% increase in the number of students enrolled (HDCT), and a 4% increase in full time equivalents (FTE).
Ninety-one percent (91%) of our undergraduate population is matriculated, and this represents the largest proportion of matriculated students in the College's history.
The Division of Natural Sciences and Mathematics continues to demonstrate growth in its proportional share of declared and intended majors.
A decline in the proportion of business students continues to impact the number of majors in Professional Studies.


