#### The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey Fall 1998 Enrollment Report

#### **SUMMARY STATEMENTS**

- The College's enrollment management program has recruited the largest number of new undergraduate students in the history of Stockton. The record total of 1548 students includes 778 freshmen, 703 transfers and 67 readmits.
- The total headcount enrollment (Undergraduate & Graduate) has remained relatively stable, at 6157. The FTE generated by this population is 5049.
- Overall graduate enrollment has increased by 58%, from 165 to 260. The corresponding FTE increased by 80%, from 70 to 126. The number of new graduate students has more than doubled since last year, increasing from 48 to 99.
- The Master of Arts in Instructional Technology program has the largest number of graduate students, while the Master of Physical Therapy has the largest proportion of FTE.
- Our newest graduate program, the Master of Arts in Holocaust and Genocide Studies, has attracted 35 students its first semester.
- Last year's record percentage of matriculated to non-matriculated students has been broken again. Currently, 94% of the undergraduate population are matriculated.
- A record 80% of undergraduate students are full-time. The average credit load per student has increased to 13.4.
- For the second year in a row, both Arts & Humanities and Social and Behavioral Science divisions have experienced increases in declared and intended majors.
- The third semester freshmen retention figure is 84%, a 1% increase over last year's percentage. The proportion of minority freshmen retained for the same time period rose from 79% to 86%, a 7% increase.
- A record 1357 students were graduated during Fiscal Year 1998. This represents a 12% increase when compared to that of Fiscal Year 1997.
