- The college's enrollment management program has been successful in attracting a quality applicant pool from which to enroll new students.
- The total number of new freshmen increased by $4 \%$ to 783. In addition, 769 new transfers, 89 readmits, and 88 new graduate students enrolled.
- Total SAT scores for regularly admitted freshmen increased by 3 points to 1129 and remain more than 100 points higher than New Jersey and National averages for college-bound students.
- The undergraduate headcount of 6136 constitutes an increase of 160 (or 3\%) over last year's figure. The full-time equivalent (FTE) has increased by 3\% to 5216.
- The average credit load per undergraduate student is consistent with last year’s 13.6 credits. The credit load for graduate students is 7.4.
- Eighty two percent (82\%) of all undergraduates are full-time.
- The combinedheadcount for graduate and undergraduate students has reached 6459, a new record. Combined FTE is 5416, which is $2 \%$ greater than last year.
- The 6 year graduation rate for the 1995 first-time full-time freshman cohort is $62 \%$. This figure is significantly higher than state and national norms.
- Instructional Technology continues to attract the largest number of graduate students, and the Physical Therapy Program generates the largest proportion of FTE.
