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SUMMARY STATEMENTS

- The College's enrollment management program has recruited the largest number of new undergraduate students in the history of Stockton. The record total of **1,610** students includes 733 freshmen, 781 transfers and 96 readmits.
- Overall graduate enrollment has increased by 24%, from 260 to 323. The corresponding FTE increased by 41%, from 126 to 178. The number of new graduate students is consistent with last year's number at 97.
- The total headcount enrollment (Undergraduate & Graduate) is a record 6,298. The FTE generated by this population is a record 5,177.
- The Master of Arts in Instructional Technology program has the largest number of graduate students, while the Master of Physical Therapy has the largest proportion of FTE.
- Our newest graduate program, the Master of Science in Occupational Therapy, has enrolled 14 students its first semester.
- The percentage of matriculated to non-matriculated for undergraduate students remains at 94%. Of the graduate population, **74%** is matriculated.
- A record 81% of undergraduate students are full-time. The average credit load per student remains 13.4.
- For the fourth year in a row, Arts & Humanities has experienced an increase in the number of declared and intended majors.
- The six-year graduation rate is a record 60%.
- A record 1,401 undergraduate and graduate degrees were granted during Fiscal Year 1999. Thirty graduate degrees and 1,371 undergraduate degrees were awarded.
