Stockton State College Spring 1993 Final Enrollment Report Summary

ENROLLMENT.

The Spring 1993 final enrollment figure is 5,548. This represents an increase of 106 students (or 2%) when compared to the Spring 1992 figure of 5,442 students.

D FTE.

The full-time equivalent (FTE) figure generated by the Spring 1993 student population is **4,501**. This represents an increase of 128 FTE (or 3%) when compared to the 4,373 FTE reported last spring.

□ NEW STUDENTS.

As a result of the most selective spring admissions process to date, a record **1009** applications yielded 540 admitted students (or **54%**). This compares with Spring 1992's admission rate of 71%.

Of these 540 admitted students, the college enrolled **417** new students (**77%**). Twenty (**20**) of these were first-time freshmen, while **343** were transfers. Additionally, among the new student population, **54** were readmits. Spring 1992 data showed 454 new students of whom 21 were first-time freshmen, 386 were transfers, and 47 were readmits.

□ RETENTION.

The fall-to-spring term retention rate has increased substantially. In Spring 1993, the college retained a record **96%** of its freshman class population. In Spring 1992, the retention rate was 93%.

GRADUATES.

The FY 93 graduates to date number 465 which is comparable to last year's reported number of 464.

DECLARED AND INTENDED MAJORS.

The Division of Natural Sciences and Mathematics has shown the largest increase among the academic divisions in the percentage of declared and intended majors. During the current semester, NAMS intended and declared majors represent 20% of the matriculated undergraduate population. In Spring 1992 the proportion was 17%.
