The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey Spring 1995 Final Enrollment Report Summary

□ ACADEMIC YEAR 1994-1995 ANNUALIZED ENROLLMENT AND FTE.

Annualized headcount and full-time equivalent (FTE) figures are produced by averaging fall and spring term figures.

The annualized total headcount for the 1994-95 academic year is **5,627**, as compared to 5,619 for AY 1993-94. The annualized FTE generated for the 1994-95 academic year is **4,590**, compared to the previous academic year figure of 4,575.

□ SPRING 1995 ENROLLMENT AND FTE.

The Spring 1995 final enrollment figure is **5,550**, compared to the Spring 1994 figure of 5,456. This represents an increase of 94 students (or **2**%). The Spring 1995 full-time equivalent (FTE) figure is **4,508**. This represents an increase of 64 FTE (or **1**%) when compared to the 4,444 FTE reported last spring.

□ NEW STUDENTS.

Of 581 admitted students, the college enrolled **446** new students, or 72 more students than last spring. This admit-to-enroll ratio of 77% is the highest in more than a decade.

Twenty (20) of these new students were first-time freshmen, while 374 were transfers. Additionally, among the new student population, 52 were students who were readmitted to the college. Spring 1994 data showed 374 new students of whom 22 were first-time freshmen, 314 were transfers, and 38 were readmits.

□ RETENTION AND GRADUATION RATES.

The fall-to-spring term retention rate has remained stable, and impressive, at 94%. The Fiscal Year 1995 graduates to date number a record 486, an increase of 15 students or (3%) over last year's previous record number of 471.

□ DECLARED AND INTENDED MAJORS.

Four of the five academic divisions of the college have evidenced slight growth or enrollment stability with respect to the percentage of intended and declared majors during the past two years.
