#### The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey Spring 1996 Final Enrollment Report Summary

#### ACADEMIC YEAR 1995-1996 ANNUALIZED ENROLLMENT AND FTE. Annualized headcount and full-time equivalent (FTE) figures are produced by averaging fall and spring term totals. The annualized total headcount for the 1995-96 academic year is 5736, an increase of 2% over the AY 1994-95 figure of 5627. The annualized FTE generated for the 1995-96 academic year is 4732, up 3% from last year's figure of 4590. SPRING 1996 ENROLLMENT AND FTE. The Spring 1996 final enrollment figure is 5599, compared to the Spring 1995 figure of 5550. This represents an increase of 49 students (or 1%). The Spring 1996 full-time equivalent (FTE) figure is 4621. This represents an increase of 113 FTE (or 3%) when compared to the 4508 FTE reported last spring. This gain represents the highest proportional increase in FTE per headcount for the Spring semester in the history of the college. The percentage of the student body studying full-time increased to an all time high of 79%, up 2% from Spring 1995 figures. NEW STUDENTS. Of 457 new students enrolled for the Spring 1996 term, 29 are first-time freshmen, 364 new transfers, and 64 readmitted students. The Spring 1995 cohort of 446 new students consisted of more transfers (374), and fewer readmits (52) and first-time freshmen (20). RETENTION AND GRADUATION RATES. The Fall-to-Spring term overall retention rate remains an impressive 94%. Minority retention rates (Black and Hispanic) are similarly impressive. Fiscal Year 1996 graduates to date number 502, a record for the institution and a 3% increase over last year's figure. MATRICULATED VS. NON-MATRICULATED STUDENTS.

Matriculated students comprise 93% of all students enrolled. This constitutes a 2% increase in the percentage of matriculated students when compared to Spring 1995, and the highest proportion of

matriculated students in the college's history.
