# **SUMMARY STATEMENTS**

# Total Population (Undergraduate and Graduate)

# **■** Spring 1998

Headcount and FTE: The combined undergraduate and graduate final enrollment figure is a record 5909, exceeding last year's total of 5815 by 94 (or 2%). The corresponding full-time equivalent (FTE), also a record, is 4848, and exceeds last year's figure by 123 (or 3%).

### ■ 1997-98 Annualized¹

Headcount and FTE: The combined annualized headcount for undergraduate and graduate students has attained a new high, at 6058 students. This is an increase of 3% over last year's figure. The annualized FTE generated was a record 4965, and exceeds last year's figure by 3%.

# Undergraduate Students

## ■ Spring 1998

Headcount and FTE: As a result of a planned decrease in the number of non-matriculated students, the final undergraduate headcount for Spring 1998 is 5729, which is 12 less than last year's total. However, as a result of increased course load the FTE figure exceeds last year's by 70 (or 2%), for a new spring record of 4773.

*New Students:* The 474 new students who registered this semester include 22 first-time freshmen, 397 transfers, and 55 readmitted students.

Matriculated vs. Non-matriculated Students: The number of matriculated students increased by 1, for a total of 5391 students; the number of non-matriculated students was held to 338, a reduction of 4% when compared to last spring. Similarly, the percentage of full-time students has increased by 2% to 80%.

Retention: Fall-to-Spring retention of all freshmen remains high, at 95%. The overall rate for minority freshmen has increased to a new record of 97%.

Graduation Rates: The number of FY98 degrees granted to date is 550.

### ■ 1997-98 Annualized

Headcount and FTE: The 1997-98 annualized headcount for undergraduate students has attained a new high, at 5885 students. This is a slight increase over last year's figure. The annualized FTE generated was a record 4892, 2% more than last year.

### **Graduate Students**

# **■** Spring 1998

Enrollment and FTE: This spring's total includes students representing four master's programs. A total of 180 students generated 75 FTE, more than doubling last spring's headcount, and tripling its FTE.

Matriculated vs. Non-Matriculated Students: Of the 180 graduate students, 44% are matriculated, and 12% are full-time.

### ■ 1997-98 Annualized

Headcount and FTE: This is the first year for which an annualized figure for graduate students can be determined. The 1997-98 annualized headcount for graduate students was 173, while the corresponding FTE was 73.
