## -SUMMARY-

#### Spring 2002 Enrollment:

#### New Students

<u>Undergraduate</u>: The **557** new undergraduates who registered this semester include **25** first-time freshmen, **452** transfer students, and **80** readmitted students.

Graduate: 25 new students enrolled in four of Stockton's six graduate programs.

#### Headcount & FTE

Total Population: There are 6199 students registered, generating 5157 FTE.

<u>Undergraduate:</u> The **5914** students enrolled this semester represent a record headcount. The corresponding FTE, also a record, is **4960**.

<u>Graduate:</u> There are **285** students enrolled this semester with a corresponding FTE of **197**.

<u>Matriculated vs. Non-matriculated Students:</u> The percentage of matriculated undergraduate students remains stable at 95%, and increased from 80% to 83% for graduate students.

<u>Credit load:</u> Undergraduates maintained their average of 13.4 credits this semester, while graduate students increased their average credit load from 8.0 to 8.2.

#### AY01-02 Annualized<sup>1</sup> Headcount & FTE

<u>Total Population:</u> The combined annualized headcount is a record **6329** students, which exceeds last year's record by 2%. FTE generated was a record **5287**, and also exceeds last year's record by 2%.

<u>Undergraduate:</u> The AY01-02 annualized headcount for undergraduate students is **6025** students, a **2%** increase over the AY00-01 annualized headcount. The corresponding FTE is a record **5088**, an increase of 2%.

Graduate: The graduate annualized headcount is 304 students with a corresponding FTE of 199.
