Spring 2006 Enrollment Report* SUMMARY STATEMENTS

Spring 2006 Enrollment

New Students:

<u>Undergraduate</u>: The **566** new undergraduates who registered this semester include **12** first-time freshmen, **478** transfer students, and **76** readmitted students.

Graduate: 37 new students enrolled in six of Stockton's eight graduate programs.

<u>Post Baccalaureate</u>: **2** new students enrolled in the post-baccalaureate Education certificate program.

Headcount & FTE:

<u>Total Population</u>: There are **6685** students registered, generating **5639** FTE.

<u>Undergraduate</u>: The college enrolled **6260** students this semester generating **5389** FTE.

<u>Graduate (including post baccalaureate)</u>: There are **425** students enrolled this semester with a corresponding FTE of **250**.

Matriculated vs. Non-Matriculated Students: The percentage of matriculated undergraduate students increased from **96%** to **97%**, while the percentage of matriculated graduate students held steady at **76%**.

Credit load: Undergraduate credit load also held steady at **13.8** credits this semester, while graduate students' average credit load decreased to **7.1.**

AY 05-06 Annualized Headcount & FTE**

Total Population: The combined annualized headcount is **6860** students, which exceeds last year's figure by .2%. FTE generated is **5814** and exceeds last year's figure by .19%.

Undergraduate: The AY 05-06 annualized headcount for undergraduate students is **6416** students, a slight decrease (-.15%) from the AY 04-05 annualized headcount. The corresponding FTE is **5559**, an increase of .12% over last year's figure of **5553**.

Graduate (including post baccalaureate): The graduate annualized headcount is **445**, a 6% increase, and **256** FTE, a 2.4% increase.
