Galloway, NJ – Stockton University's Manahawkin Instructional Site and Office of Service-Learning will host a free screening of "The Trials of Muhammad Ali," on **Wednesday, Oct. 14**.

This feature-length documentary film covers Ali's toughest bout, his battle to overturn the fiveyear prison sentence he received for refusing U.S. military service. "Trials" is not a boxing film. It is a fight film tracing a formative period in Ali's life, one that is remarkably unknown to young people today and often neglected by those who remember him as a boxer.
