Stockton Designates First Ever HERO of the Year

Galloway Township, NJ- Chelsea Gallagher, a senior criminal justice major at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey and a resident of Brick, New Jersey, was named the first ever Stockton College Designated HERO of the Year by the College and the HERO Campaign for Designated Drivers.

Gallagher, a student in the dual BA/MA degree program in criminal justice, was nominated by Jamie Sofia, a Tri Sigma sorority sister and president of Stockton's Greek Council. Sofia wrote in her nomination essay, "I was asked, by the HERO Campaign, to write about someone who exemplifies a hero in my eyes. I have many [sorority] sisters who are there [for me]; however, Chelsea Gallagher stands out from them all."

Chelsea Gallagher received a phone call one day from Stephen B. Davis, Stockton's associate dean of students, who read through a number of Stockton HERO nomination essays. Gallagher said, "I was very surprised when I received the phone call telling me I had won. My sorority sister had told me earlier that she nominated me, but I was still really surprised and honored to have won this title."

A photo of Gallagher, wearing her HERO Campaign t-shirt, will be displayed on a billboard to help promote safe and responsible drinking.

Jamie Sofia wrote in her essay, "Chelsea puts her sisters' safety and well being before anything else. I believe that Chelsea is truly a hero." Sofia also explained that aside from being a devoted sorority sister, a dedicated RA (resident assistant) at Stockton, and a well-rounded student, both academic and extracurricular, Gallagher is also a great sister at home to her two siblings who have been diagnosed with autism.
