Galloway Township, **NJ** - Some 185 golfers and donors helped raise nearly \$120,000 at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey's Annual Golf Classic at Stockton Seaview Hotel & Golf Club on Sept. 30.

The Stockton Golf Classic was played on the Bay and Pines courses at historic Stockton Seaview. The net proceeds of the event benefit students.

"Our focus is on supporting Stockton students, and the Golf Classic provides an opportunity for the community to engage with us in our effort. We received an outpouring of support from our sponsors and the community, and we are truly grateful," said Dr. Philip T. Ellmore, chief development officer and executive director of the College Foundation. He said this year's turnout was one of the largest ever.

LPGA Professional Laura Diaz and her coach and father, PGA Pro Ron Philo, Sr. offered players a chance to "Beat the Pro," one of the highlights of the event. Diaz hit two holes-in-one in a single tournament earlier this year.
