Galloway Township, NJ- The Sara and Sam Schoffer Holocaust Resource Center at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey is proud to announce the publication of two memoirs: "Feathers, Smoke, a Shattered Family: A Three Year Old Survivor of Terezin" by Berl Lazarus and "Of Being Numerous: World War II as I Saw It" by Bernard Friedenberg.

Berl Lazarus is a child survivor of the Holocaust. He was three years old when he was flown from Terezin Concentration Camp in Czechoslovakia to England. Once in England, he was placed in an orphanage at Bulldogs Bank, whose staff was trained by Anna Freud. Lazarus' American Aunt, Ruth Oster, found him there and he was able to immigrate to the United States. Later, Lazarus served with the U.S. Army in Vietnam where he volunteered at a local orphanage.

Bernard Friedenberg, a Jewish War Veteran, was a medic in WWII. He fought in a number of places including Algeria, Sicily, Omaha Beach, Aachen and the Battle of the Bulge.
