Galloway Township, NJ – Jeffrey Rosen, president and CEO of the National Constitution Center, will deliver the keynote address at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey's Constitution Day event on **Wednesday, Sept. 18 at 6 p.m.** in the Campus Center Event Room at the main campus here.

Rosen, a prominent constitutional scholar, influential legal commentator and best-selling author and journalist, will focus on privacy and security issues in his speech. He will also briefly address other emerging constitutional issues, including voting rights, immigration reform and affirmative action.

Most recently, Rosen co-edited "Constitution 3.0: Freedom and Technological Change." The book poses thought-provoking questions on the ways that technology will challenge our Constitutional values and to propose ways of preserving these values.
