Galloway Township, **NJ** - Students in Dr. Norma Boakes' "Art and Math of Origami" class have handcrafted over 125 folded paper figures to be displayed at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey on **Tuesday**, **April 22**, **2014**.

The display will include works evoking favorite holidays, Origami-style, such as 4th of July, Easter, winter holidays, Halloween, and of course, Earth Day, when the event takes place.

Dr. Boakes, an associate professor of Education, uses origami as a way to educate students about culture, history and mathematics. Her students learn the traditional Japanese art of paper folding while developing an understanding of the art's link to geometric concepts and its cultural significance.

The showcase will take place in the lower F-Wing Atrium, located outside the Bjork Library, on the college's main campus, from 10:30 a.m. to 12:20 p.m.
