The Academy Award nominated film, *The Courage to Care*, narrated by Elie Wiesel, will be shown. This documentary film is about Righteous Gentiles during World War II. The film tells the life stories of non-Jews who risked their lives to save Jews during the Holocaust. The rescuers and survivors are from countries in Europe—France, the Netherlands, and Poland.

The event will have a presentation including a question and answer session led by the film's coproducer, Dr. Carol Rittner, RSM.

Dr. Carol Rittner is a Roman Catholic nun (Religious Sisters of Mercy), Distinguished Professor of Holocaust & Genocide Studies and the Dr. Marsha R. Grossman Professor of Holocaust Studies at Stockton College.
