Galloway Township, NJ- The Colonel Kenneth R. Stow Memorial Scholarship Golf Tournament invites area golfers to tee off in support of Stockton's student veterans.

The tournament, sponsored by the Office of Veteran Affairs and the Stockton Student Veterans Organization, will be held at the Stockton Seaview Hotel and Golf Resort in Galloway on **Friday**, **May 3, 2013** with a shotgun start at noon. All proceeds directly benefit scholarships for Stockton student veterans.

Colonel Kenneth R. Stow was instrumental in founding the administrative component of Stockton College during its early years and supported the College with his time and talents. Stow served more than three decades in the U.S. Air Force. His wife, Dr. Jo Frances Stow, honors his memory each year through the Col. Kenneth R. Stow Veterans Memorial Scholarship, which is awarded to returning U.S. military veterans attending Stockton College.

Thomas O'Donnell, assistant dean of students, said, "I am very proud to be a part of a College that is known for our Veteran Affairs initiatives. The money we raise for our brave men and women who serve this great nation allows them to continue their educational dreams and become outstanding leaders in our communities. Stockton leads the way by doing the right thing for our heroes."

Stockton was first named a military-friendly school in 2011 by G.I. Jobs Magazine, which ranked Stockton in the top 15% of military-friendly schools in the nation. Gov. Chris Christie designated Stockton as the first state college to offer the first pilot program for VETeach, which provides a path for veterans to become educators.
