**Galloway Township, NJ** – The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey presents a free film screening of the documentary *Sex and Justice*, on September 14, 2012.

The film will be shown in the Campus Center Theatre at 2 p.m. The event is free, open to the public and no ticket is required. A discussion will take place immediately following the screening.

Sex and Justice is about the 1991 Anita Hill-Clarence Thomas hearings before the United States Senate. Anita Hill's historic testimony raised nationwide awareness of the issue of sexual harassment in the workplace.

The screening is the first in Stockton's 2012 Constitution Day series of events.

Constitution Day, sometimes referred to as Citizenship Day, is an American observance that recognizes the adoption of the United States Constitution and those who have become United States Citizens. It is observed on September 17, or on the closest weekday to September 17 when that date falls on a Saturday or Sunday.
