Galloway, NJ – The Stockton Center on Successful Aging (SCOSA) presents a craft workshop for seniors on Saturday, June 1, 2013 at the Noyes Museum of Art of the Richard Stockton College of New Jersey. It runs from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the Museum, 733 Lilly Lake Road, just off Route 9 in the Oceanville section of Galloway.

Participants at the workshop will learn how to weave a seat for a solid oak unfinished footstool. The workshop will be lead by Niki Giberson, owner and operator of Swan Bay Farm in Port Republic.
