Galloway Township, NJ- The Stockton Center on Successful Aging (SCOSA) will sponsor a workshop for older adults on making holiday bird ornaments at The Noyes Museum of Art, 733 Lily Lake Road, in the Oceanville section of Galloway Township. The workshop is scheduled for Saturday, December 8, 2012 from 10:30am to 12:30pm.

Participants will learn the use of wool felting needles to sculpt the bird of their choice, which can be used for a holiday ornament, or to decorate year round. The wool used for this project comes from Swan Bay Farm in Port Republic where 11 beautifully fleeced sheep live with Niki Giberson, the workshop instructor.
