



Kwanzaa Celebration

Galloway, NJ – The Unified Black Students Society (UBSS) at Stockton University will present its 42nd Annual Kwanzaa Celebration at 7 p.m., **Friday, Dec. 1** in the Campus Center Event Room.

The event will feature traditional music and performances by Universal African Dance and Drum Ensemble, Harambee and Recognition of Elders ceremonies and a traditional Karamu feast.

Stockton's Kwanzaa event, which is free and open to the public has been a cultural tradition for four decades and is believed to be one of the largest and oldest Kwanzaa celebrations in southern New Jersey.

UBSS President Mahalia Bazile believes that hosting the event is important, as it preserves a lasting tradition at the university, allowing the Stockton and local communities to come together as one.
