#### **Approval of Minutes**

President Carl called the meeting to order at 04:30 pm and moved to approve the minutes from November 24th 2015, seconded by Senator Victoria D.

#### **President's Report**

President Archut Jr. began by welcoming everyone to the meeting. President Carl asked for a moment of silence for Alexander Pannizzo, a freshman student who passed away recently. Currently, the Senate is working with the Office of Dean of Students and Residential Life to come up with a way to honor his life.

President Carl yields the floor to Dean Honaker who will discuss about the new modifications to the Alma Mater. Dean Honaker presented the Student Senate gave a brief history to the new changes to the University's Alma Matar. The new version is half long and will be presented at the Winter Commencement. Dean Honaker requested Student Senate to formally vote on endorsing the new changes to the University's Alma Matar.

Senator Maryam moved for the request of the Student Senate endorsing the new changes to the University's Alma Matar; Seconded by Senator Jessica.

President Carl reported he appointed Senator Alex Dannecker to the Information and Technology Advisory Board. President Carl yields the floor to the Bob Heinrich, Chief Information Officer. Mr. Heinrich briefly talked about the Student Electronic Communication Strategy Document, endorsed by the Student Affairs Committee. Mr. Heinrich also discussed the new email services being offered from the Office of Computer/Telecommunication Service. The new services are to cut down the amount of emails being emailed to students at Stockton University, and the new addition of Color Printing on campus for students. The Floor was yield back to President Carl.

President Carl reported that the two resolutions passed at the last Student Senate meeting, Attendance Policy Resolution and Including Majors on the Diploma Resolution, were greatly accepted by the Faculty Senate. President Carl and Vice President Nick are going to meet with Brian Tyrell to discuss further on these resolutions.

President Carl reported that the Executive Cabinet (EC) met on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2015. The E-Board unanimously voted that the Vice President will take minutes for all future Full Committee Meeting. Senator Carly Bulgia gave a presentation on why Student Senate should give its endorsement to "It's On Us, Not On My Campus," sexual assault awareness campaign. The EC unanimously agreed to support with the recommendation that Senator Carly give the same presentation to the Full Senate at the next Full Committee Meeting. The EC approved the timeline for the Spring 2016 Student Senate Election.

President Carl reported that himself, VP Nick, Chairperson Emily, Chairperson Haley, Chairperson Victoria D., Senator Carly, and Senator Ike attended the National Conference on Student Leadership (NCSL). At the conference President Carl discussed with the Student Government Association (SGA) President of William Patterson about creating a council of SGA Presidents throughout New Jersey. It will help keep open communication throughout New Jersey's Colleges and Universities student population.

#### **Vice President's Report**

President Carl yields the floor to Nick Persia on the Vice President report. Vice President (VP) Nick reported that Senator Tyler Graff was removed from Student Senate for accumulating to many absences. President Carl is in the process to replace former Senator Tyler's position.

VP Nick reported that he learned at the NCSL the accountability processes at other Institutions. VP Nick will be looking further into those Institutions' accountability to help improve Student Senate's accountability.

VP Nick reminded the Senators to please sign you're name on the sheet when doing office hours. That is the only way to hold accountable for your office hours.

VP Nick reminded the Senators to please make sure you complete the IDEAs surveys and to remind students to complete them as well. It is the only way to give feedback on your professors.

VP Nick reported that the Student Senate office blinds were removed to create a open and welcome environment for students when they visit the office. Stickers for advertisement will be placed on the windows.

VP Nick reported that the Students Helping Students mentor program, working with Sparkle, will be working with Atlantic City students. There is no transportation currently in place for the students. There is work in progress to find transportation for the students. VP Nick yields the floor to President Carl.

#### Finance

President Carl yields the floor to Chairperson (Chair) Haley for the Finance Committee report. Chair Haley reported that the last budget request meeting is 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2015 at 7pm in meeting room 3. Budgets are due on 26 January 2016 at 5pm. #### **Academic Affairs**

President Carl yields the floor to Chair Emily for the Academic Affairs report. Chair Emily reports that she had a meeting with Tom Grites to discuss the idea of creating a blackboard courses for majors. With the creation of blackboard courses for majors students would be able to access academic information from other student, professors, as well as looking at the resources provided on the course page. The blackboard page would be able to connect the confusion of course selection, academic difficulties, career paths, and networking opportunities in one place. The academic affairs committee believes that there is a lack of knowledge and communication between students and their academic course path and career paths. By implementing this solution the committee hopes there was an eliminate these problems. Chair Emily was refereed to Linda Feeney the director of E-Learning. Linda and Emily discussed concerns and possibilities of creating blackboard courses for majors as well as discussed the benefits of online classes. Further communication with the committee and the academic affairs committee will be held to create a pilot blackboard course program for specific majors.

Chair Emily reported that the committee is also doing research to promote the minors that are available to Stockton students. The committee has noticed there are a number of minors that are unpopular with the student body. To encourage the addition of minors the committee is working on creating a list of minors to prompt with specific correlating majors. The committee believes by the creation of this list we would be able to increase the interest in minors. By publicizing the benefits adding a minor to incoming freshmen they will be able to consider the option of a minor early on in their education. Further meetings will be held with academic advising to research the minors available to students.

Chair Emily reported that the Academic Affairs committee also hopes to promote the use of the student senate office for homework and study sessions to all students. The committee plans to work with the public relations committee to promote the use of the office as an area to study in hopes that the students will take advantage of the space as an invitation to get to know their senators in a studious environment.

Chair Emily reported that Senator Stephanie made a suggestion box for the graduate student's lounge to create a greater transparency for the graduate students at Stockton. From this gesture the committee hopes to gain feedback, and concerns from the graduates students.

Chair Emily yields the floor back to President Carl

#### **Government Affairs**

President Carl yields the floor to Chair Maryam for the Government Affairs report. Chair Maryam first announced the welcoming of the new committee member Senator Deon Davis. The committee is excited to Senator Deon Davis. The committee is looking forward to having him on our team! Chair Maryam reported that the committee is currently in the process of planning events for the Higher Education Awareness Week this Spring Semester and will continue to focus on topics within higher education and civic engagement. Chair Maryam reports that the new constitutional amendments will be discussed at the next full Committee meeting on monetary funds. There will be minor changes that will be discussed and then voted on 8 December 2015. If there are any ideas please submit them to the committee.
