President Carl reported he met with the parking committee on 19 January 2016. The committee discussed some ideas and will be voting on these issues at the next parking committee meeting.

President Carl reported that he meet with Dead of Students Dr. Santana, Acting Chief of Police Parker, and others from External Affairs about Emergency Preparedness at the University.

President Carl reported on the fundraising status for Steve Hensel, a student at Stockton University who was recently diagnosed with brain cancer. To date, the Stockton Community has been able to raise \$17,000 to help offset medical expenses.

President Carl reported that Stockton University President Dr. Kesslemen will meet with students on 23 March 2016 from 4:30 pm - 6:00 pm to give his vision for the future of Stockton University.

President Carl reported that this coming Friday he will be meeting with the Sub-Committee of Student Affairs for the Atlantic City Task Force. They will be discussing further progress of the future Atlantic City Campus.

President Carl concludes his report.

Vice President's Report

President Carl yields the floor to Nick Persia on the Vice President report. Vice President (VP) Nick swore in the new Student Senate Senator Kimberly Emmanuel.

The Chair Emily reports that the Academic Affairs Committee is scheduling a meeting to speak with Peter Hagan from Academic Advising to discuss ways they can educate students on all the minors that are available.

Chair Emily reports that the committee is looking into hosting an event promoting some of the more unpopular minors. This event would educate students on the benefits of the minor and give interested students a direct link to minor coordinators.

Chair Emily reports that the Committee is in discussion about the possibility of adding a label to courses only offered in the fall or spring semesters. These labels would help to keep students informed on the best time to take essential classes for their degree. It would also alleviate some of the confusion student's face when scheduling classes.

Chair Emily reports that the committee is in dicussion with the Public Relations Committee in promoting the use of the student senate office for homework and study sessions to all students.

Chair Maryam reported that as it pertains to the student activity fee budget, the Government Affairs committee will be looking at methods and solutions that would allow all students attending academic and organizational conferences be affordable and accessible. Fundraising, personal contributions, and club contributions will be capped by percentages or in a manner that would balance the budget and allow all students to invest an equal share in their commitments to organizational and academic conferences.

Higher Education Awareness Week has now evolved into Higher Education Awareness Month. Throughout the month of March, the committee will be hosting various events, panels and tabling activities to bring awareness about college affordability, financial literacy, careers in higher education and civic engagement as well as social/political activism. The Student Senate shall consist of one branch composed of twenty-seven undergraduate and graduate students, dually elected in the spring and the fall. Twenty-three students will be elected in the spring, of those 23 seats, 2 will be reserved for graduate level students, and the remaining four will be selected from first year and transfer students in a separate fall election
