- For returning students
- ✓ Must file by April 15, 2021 for Fall 2021 aid.
- Affects State Aid:
 - ✓ Tuition Aid Grant (TAG)
 - Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF)




FINANCIAL AID BORROWING HISTORY

Monitored annually:

- ✓ Grades = cumulative 2.0
- ✓ Pace = Completing 67% of your attempted credits
